CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO RESOLUTION NO. 11-0205

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AIRPORT STAFF TO ISSUE A REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS (RFP) FOR MAINTENANCE OF THE AIRPORT'S WATER PERIMETER SECURITY BUOY SYSTEM, AND TO ENTER INTO NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE TOP RANKED PROPOSER

- WHEREAS, the current SFO Water Perimeter Security Zone incorporates 25 buoys, along with anchoring hardware, located 200 feet from the Airport's perimeter which act as the defineation point for the Airport's restricted area and the public waterways; and
- WHEREAS, constantly shifting tidal currents and a harsh maritime environment create significant stress on the current buoy system subjecting each part of every buoy and anchoring hardware to constant varying forces such as gyration, corrosion, tidal currents, and sunlight; and
- WHEREAS, it is necessary to conduct routine maintenance of the SFO Water Perimeter Security Zone to ensure that all pieces of this security zone function as intended; and
- WHEREAS, the Airport purchased the original supply and installation of its buoy system through a blanket purchase order process in July 2004; and
- WHEREAS, in April 2008, the Airport entered into a formal maintenance and repair agreement with Underwater Resources, Inc. for period of two (2) years; and
- WHEREAS, on January 11, 2011, proposals were accepted for the maintenance of the system with the award going to DRS Marine, Inc. for a period of one (1) year; and
- WHEREAS, effective January 31, 2012, the current contract with DRS Marine, Inc. will expire and there will be no means for the Airport to provide for regular maintenance on the current SFO Water Perimeter Security Zone system and/or address any possible emergency situations; now, therefore be it
- RESOLVED, that the Commission authorizes Airport staff to issue an RFP for maintenance and repairs to the SFO Water Perimeter Security Zone and authorizes staff to conduct negotiations with the highest ranked proposer and, should the staff be unable to successfully conclude negotiations, staff is authorized to commence negotiations with the next highest ranked proposer for an initial three-year term with three one-year renewal options exercisable at the sole discretion of the Commission. The source of funds is within the existing Aviation Security budget and the initial three year award shall not exceed \$60,000. Staff will return to the Commission to award the contract to the successful proposer.

1. **DESCRIPTION OF WORK**

A. Concise description of proposed work: This request is for design-build services, separate from the design and integration services approved under PSC #4099-09/10 on June 6, 2011. The Airport's design consultant, approved under PSC #4099-09/10, will prepare bridging documents for the design-build request for proposal. The selected design-build contractor under this request will prepare the final design, as the Engineer of Record for the following tasks:

International Terminal and Terminal 3, Boarding Area F - Checked Baggage Inspection System (CBIS) Modernization Program: Design-build services required for the TSA's CBIS modernization program to replace security screening and associated baggage handling system (BHS) equipment that is obsolete or beyond its useful life.

International Terminal - Baggage Handling System Improvements: Design-build services required for the Airport's International Terminal BHS improvements project to replace BHS equipment that is obsolete and beyond its useful life.

Terminal 3 Boarding Area E and F BHS Transfer Lines: Design-build services required for new BHS transfer lines connecting the Boarding Area E and F BHS and CBIS. The transfer lines are necessary to provide for increasing BHS and CBIS capacity and flexibility requirements.

B. Explain why this service is necessary and the consequences of denial: The TSA initiated a Recapitalization Program for the purpose of funding the modernization of the TSA's CBIS equipment and associated BHS equipment. The International Terminal and Terminal 3, Boarding Area F CBIS is obsolete and at the end of its service life. The Airport has executed Other Transaction Agreements with the TSA for 90% reimbursement of design and construction costs under the TSA's Recapitalization Program. The CBIS has insufficient capacity and reliability to support Airport checked baggage operations, and TSA requires new equipment to reduce maintenance. All of this requires BHS design-build services.

The International Terminal BHS, outside the TSA's CBIS area, has insufficient capacity and reliability for the twenty five airlines that occupy the facility. This includes BHS mechanical, electrical and controls equipment that are beyond their service life, and must be replaced to maintain operations. This project is

integrated with the International Terminal CBIS Modernization Program and must be performed under the same design-build contract.

Aircraft gate allocations assigned under the terms of the Airport's Lease and Use Agreement with the airlines have resulted in new requirements for increased BHS and CBIS capacity and flexibility. New transfer line conveyors and controls are required between the Terminal 3, Boarding Areas E and F BHS and CBIS to maintain operations. This project is integrated with the Terminal 3, Boarding Area F CBIS Modernization Program and must be performed under the same design-build contract.

Related design and integration services have been previously provided through a contract under PSC # 4099-09/10. The baggage handling systems have been performed under design-build contracts.

3. <u>DESCRIPTION OF REQUIRED SKILLS/EXPERTISE</u>

- A. Specify required skills and/or expertise: Baggage Handling Systems design, construction and integration is unique to this specialized industry. Design requires a combination of specialized expertise in baggage handling conveyor systems, programmable logic controls, electronics, motor controls, and TSA explosives detection systems. The design and construction must meet TSA certification standards and testing to be licensed for operation.
- B. Which, if any, civil service class normally performs this work? There are no current civil service classes that can design baggage handling systems. However, civil service classes participate in Airport baggage handling systems in capacities such as building electrical power and infrastructure design. A project manager II and IV (5504 and 5508 class) will be managing this project.

WHEREAS, The SFMTA has successfully negotiated contract terms and conditions with Alta Consulting Services; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the SFMTA Board of Directors authorizes the SFMTA, through its Executive Director/CEO (or his designee), to execute Contract No. SFMTA 2008/09-18, Closed Circuit TV System Technical Installation Project, with Alta Consulting Services, Inc., to provide technical assistance and develop a master plan for a closed circuit television camera system in the subway, and provide project oversight during the installation of cameras and related security equipment; in an amount not to exceed \$230,030, and for a term of three years, with two ones, year options to extend the term at the sole discretion of the SFMTA.




