DEFINITION

Under general supervision, the essential functions of a roofer are to: maintain, repair and reroof a variety of roofs/structures as a member of a roofing crew-by preparing, handling, applying and securing various roofing materials such as heated asphalt, mineral surfaced felt, shingles, Torch On, gravel and ply sheets, while insuring that customary roofing techniques and methods are used and proper technical and safety standards are maintained; install and operate support equipment such as hoists, ladders, brackets, planks and fall protection; operate and maintain kettles and other roofing equipment in a safe and proper manner; work closely with other crafts; and perform related duties as required.

The nature of the work requires performance of heavy work such as lifting and moving tools, oquipment and supplies weighing up to 110 pounds; constant bending, reaching, pulling, climbing, balancing, squatting, and crawling, at considerable heights and pitches often in adverse weather conditions.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES

This is a journey-level class in the roofer series. It is distinguished from Job Code 9344 Roofer Supervisor in that the latter is responsible for supervising a crew of roofers.

EXAMPLES OF IMPORTANT AND ESSENTIAL DUTIES

According to Civil Service Commission Rule 109, the duties specified below are representative of the range of duties assigned to this job code/class and are not intended to be an inclusive list.

- Maintains, repairs and reroofs a variety of roofs by replacing broken slate, tile or shingle, applying additional layers of <u>felt-cap sheet</u> over a built-up roof and removing old <u>cap</u> <u>sheet/</u>felt. Applies modified bitumen and one-ply systems.
- 2. Cleans and prepares roof surfaces and replaces with new roofing material when necessary.
- 3. Safely lifts and handles roofing materials such as asphalt, <u>gravel</u>, ply_sheet<u>s</u>, <u>Torch On</u>, and mineral surfaced cap_sheets with a variety of handtools such as axes, razor knives, tin snips and flat bars.
- 4. Quarters asphalt plugs with an axe, placing asphalt in kettle and transporting hot asphalt in service buckets and high-boy or low-boy drums, to designated areas.
- 5. Assembles, and operates, and maintains equipment in a safe and proper manner such as hoists, cranes, asphalt kettles, ladders, brackets, or planks and fall protection.
- 6. Secures equipment to iensure safety and prevent damage to buildings, equipment and

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supplies or prevent injury to personnel.

- 7. Waterproofs floors, bathrooms, showers, concrete slabs, planter boxes, and pilings to achieve a watertight seal.
- 8. Inspects existing roof surfaces (membranes, tile, etc.) for roof or systems failure as part of an on-going preventive maintenance program.
- 9. Drives city vehicles to work site and/or to pick up and transport equipment and supplies.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES

<u>Knowledge of</u>: Maintenance, repair and reroofing methods and procedures; purpose, use and care of roofing tools, materials and equipment; and safety methods and procedures required for roofing activities.

<u>Ability and Skill to</u>: Understand and follow oral instructions; communicate with supervisors, coworkers and the public; perform physical tasks requiring physical effort and dexterity such as working at considerable heights atop tall buildings, climbing ladders and lifting; carrying heavy roofing tools, heavy materials and equipment; and driving city vehicles; Use tools, materials, and equipment used to maintain, repair and reroof a variety of roofs of new and existing construction; *Ability to lift and carry materials weighing up to 110 pounds for distances up to 25 feet.*

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

These minimum qualifications establish the education, training, experience, special skills and/or license(s) which are required for employment in the classification.
