Under general supervision, the 9212 Aviation Security Analyst monitors, observes, inspects and evaluates airport facilities to ensure safe and secure operating conditions for enforcement of the Airport Security Program and ensure compliance with Federal, Airport and Transportation Security Regulations.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES

Class 9212 Aviation Security Analyst is distinguished from Class 9213 Airfield Safety Officer by the latter's responsibility for performing airfield patrol and inspection. Class 9212 Aviation Security Analyst is further distinguished from Class 9220 Aviation Security Operations Supervisor in that the latter is responsible for immediate supervision of employees in the former class.

- 7. Responds to security breaches, violations, and all emergencies; acts as first responders to all incidents or accidents on the airfield/ramp area, and, as required, administers first aid. Maintains emergency equipment and supplies to be used to respond to any Airport incidents or accidents; sets up and operates the Mobile Command Post.
- 8. Investigates all airfield incidents and accidents, and identifies potential contributing factors for airfield safety and security; recommends corrective action, including facility repairs/

upgrades, and/or new or improved procedures and policies.

- 9. Identifies proper placement and storage of hazardous materials on the airfield; maintains and coordinates removal of ground handling equipment; participates in safety risk assessments; compiles hazard data into Safety Management System (SMS) reports.
- 10. Prepares detailed informational and operational reports related to safety/security incidents, injuries, and accidents. Attends briefings for updates and shares information.
- 11. Conducts wildlife surveys and performs wildlife management and eradication duties, including habitat control, harassment and depredation.
